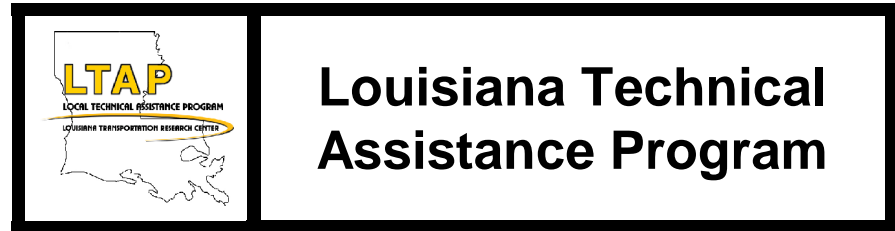

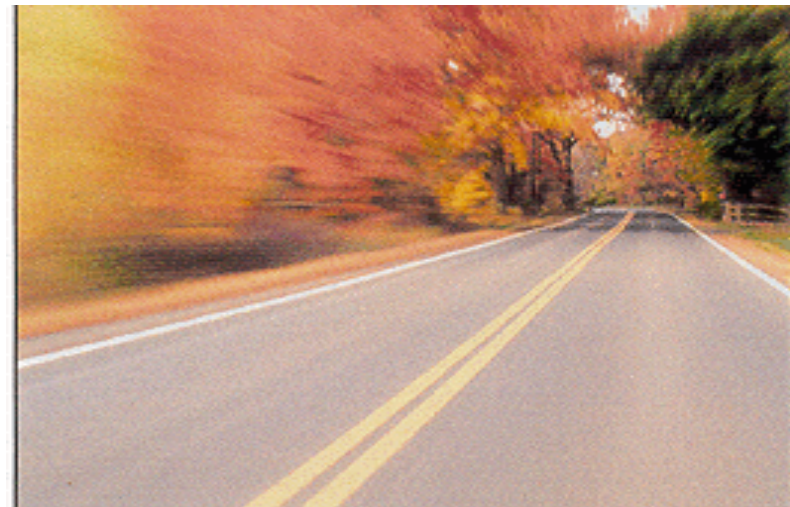

INVITATION TO THE LOCAL ROAD SAFETY PROGRAM ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS



THE LOUISIANA LOCAL ROAD SAFETY PROGRAM

The Louisiana Local Road Safety Program (LRSP) is managed through the Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP) in coordination with the LA Department of Transportation and Development and other state agencies involved with roadway safety. The intent of the program is to involve communities in identifying and mitigating local road safety issues. Funding for safety improvement projects is available. Local agency support and community development will be the key to implementation of the program and provide the greatest opportunities for success in the goal to improve roadway safety on all of Louisiana's public roads.

Through the new Louisiana Local Road Safety Program (LSRP), LTAP expands its effort to assist local governments and agencies in improving safety on locally owned and maintained roads. The LSRP combines technical assistance, training and education and other resources to help local agencies and communities develop road safety improvement plans and access funding sources to help implement safety improvement projects. Opportunities include:

- Organization and coordination – Assistance in forming community based coalitions to address local road safety issues
- Training and Education – Free training on road safety fundamentals and other specific topics to develop local capabilities to manage local road safety programs.
- Data evaluation – Assistance in analyzing available crash data and identifying data gaps
- Road Safety Reviews – On-site traffic engineering assistance in identifying and diagnosing road safety issues
- Safety Improvement Alternatives – Assistance in developing safety improvement alternatives and projects
- Resource acquisition – Assistance in identifying available funding and resources and in applying for road safety improvement project funds.

INFORMATIONAL BRIEFING And ORGANIZATIONAL MEETINGS

Join LTAP for a short informational briefing on the new Louisiana Local Road Safety Program. At this meeting you will meet the LTAP representatives who will provide technical assistance to assist your agency in initiating or enhancing your community based local road safety program. You will also have the opportunity to meet representatives of other groups interested in improving safety on your local roads and discuss how collaborative efforts may result in greater effectiveness and open the door to new funding opportunities.

The process to apply for available safety improvement project funds through the new Local Road Safety Program will be highlighted at this meeting.

Local representatives of any organization involved in the engineering, education or enforcement of road safety issues are invited. Community groups and citizens with an interest in improving road safety in their community are also encouraged to participate.
